We need the faith and example of each other for our faith to grow strong. Our faith is shared; its depth depends on how we share that faith with one another.





We all know of people who promise a lot and do not deliver; maybe each of us is a bit like that. Or the opposite – the grumbler who does the job anyway even if with half-good grace. That is the gospel image

today. Jesus prefers the one who does good rather than the one who talks about it. Jesus never looked down on the sinner because many of them believed what he said and did their best to do it.

Our prayer moves outwards to give to others, the 'prayer of the hands'. The sinner is praised for having faith, the prayer of the heart. The test of prayer is in how we love and try to be loving people in our lives.

In this context Pope Francis says: 'Professing one's faith in Christ doesn't stop at words but must be authenticated by concrete choices and gestures, by a life marked by God's love, a great life, a life with so much love for one's neighbour'; this is echoing St Ignatius: 'Love is shown in deeds not words'.

And: "You see that the love John speaks of is not the love of soap operas! No, it is something else. Christian love has a particular quality: concreteness. Christian love is concrete. Jesus Himself, when He speaks of love, speaks to us about concrete things: feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, and many concrete things. Love is concrete.'

We pray this weekend for refugees and migrants, especially for justice and compassion for those who come to our country.
