**4th CANDLE – (purple) THE ANGEL CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF LOVE –** The angels announced the good news of a Savior. God sent his only Son to earth to save us, because he loves us! “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.” (John 3:16-17)

**5th CANDLE – (white) “CHRIST CANDLE” – The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! His birth was for his death, his death was for our birth! “The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, ‘Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!’” (John 1:29)**

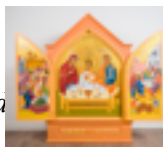
Christmas 2020 will not be anything like we would expect or want it to be. The latest guidelines state that there will be no choirs and no carol singing this year. It’s not going to sound like Christmas as we know it. The limit of persons in each Church (*including Priest, Ministers and Stewards*) is as follows: **St. Colmille’s, Swords 50 and Our Lady of the Visitation Drynam 35** (though Drynam has use of a car park and Fr. John will bring Holy Communion to those in their cars)

***Please Remember***

1. The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays, Holydays and even Christmas **IS STILL SUSPENDED**. All our Masses are available to view from the safety of our on-line broadcast. People do not have to attend in person but can participate in Mass via the web camera live stream, Mass on RTE, on RTE News Now channel or from EWTN and other networks.
2. We are still at Level 3 of lockdown. Some concessions were made to allow churches to open but they are limited and subject to the Government regulations in force on the day. These regulations can change very quickly as the situation develops.
3. Numbers attending each church are very restricted and will have to be rigorously enforced or the Mass cannot go ahead.
4. Please co-operate with the stewards who are volunteers and are doing what is required to keep you safe. They will bring you to a designated seat and you are asked to please stay in that place.
5. Admission to Masses will be strictly on a ‘first come first served’ basis and when the capacity allowed for each church is reached doors will be closed.
6. Face masks must be worn while in the church.
7. There can be no gathering outside either before or after each Mass. People will not be able to greet each other in the traditional way and social distancing of 2 meters must be observed.
8. If you are coming to Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day we would ask that you only attend on one occasion to allow others the opportunity. Archbishop Diarmuid reminds us that there are 12 Days of Christmas and we can attend Mass on any of those days.
