The Bible's Most Important People

Samson - Twelfth judge of Israel. He was called to follow a Nazarite vow, which meant he could not eat or drink anything from the grapevine, drink alcohol, cut his hair, or eat anything unclean. Samson performed amazing feats of strength. When he married, Samson choose a Philistine woman, God used the union to confront the Philistines, who ruled over Israel. Betrayed by his wife, Samson took out his anger on her people, burning their grain and performing more feats of strength. Later he fell in love with the Philistine woman Delilah, which led to his ultimate downfall. Eventually, Samson tells Delilah that he will lose his strength with the loss of his hair. God supplies Samson's power because of his consecration to God as a Nazarite, symbolised by the fact that a razor has never touched his head. Whilst asleep Delilah calls for a servant to shave Samson's seven locks. With this, Samson has finally broken the last tenet of the Nazirite oath; God leaves him, and Samson is captured by the Philistines who blind him by gouging out his eyes. After being blinded, Samson is brought to Gaza, imprisoned, and put to work grinding grain by turning a large millstone.

According to the biblical narrative, Samson died when he grasped two pillars of the Temple of Dagon, and "bowed himself with all his might" (Judges 16:30). And he bent with all his might so that the house fell on the lords and all the people who were in it.

After his death, Samson's family recovered his body from the rubble and bury him near the tomb of his father Manoah. A tomb structure which some attribute to Samson and his father stands on the top of the mountain in Tel Tzora. The Bible does not mention the fate of Delilah

The Gift of Grandparents

"You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right." Newsletter Sunday 10th September 2017

To mark the Irish National Grandparents Pilgrimage to Our Lady's Shrine in Knock this Sunday, September 10th, a newsletter on grandparents is, I think, appropriate.



Timothy's grandmother Lois was a person of living faith who had passed on her beliefs to her daughter and grandson (2 Timothy1: 5) Grandparents can play a very special part in communicating faith and values to their grandchildren. In their calling as "elders in faith' they have wonderful gifts to offer.

Self Worth – Children feel great when their grandparents give them positive recognition and unconditional love.

Heritage – Whether they are close by or far away, grandparents give their children a sense of their identity and belonging.

Acceptance – children need to know that the adults who are important to them accept their enthusiasms, ideas and activities. Such acceptance by grandparents is hugely affirming for children

Love – The gift of "I will be there for you at all times, no matter what" – whether spoken aloud, written in a letter, or shown by actions – will always be the most treasured and remembered gift of all.

It must have heartened Lois to know that Timothy grew to be a man of faith who served our Lord. We don't always know the fruit of our prayers, faith or actions.

So... grandparents, remember that you have much still to give in the nurture of faith. And parents... perhaps a word of thanks to your children's grandparents would help them to know their own worth. They have a special, God given calling!
